ABSTRACT




This research aims to identify the various moral values presented in the film Zootopia and reveal the moral values implied in the narrative.

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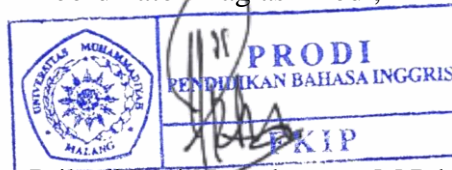
